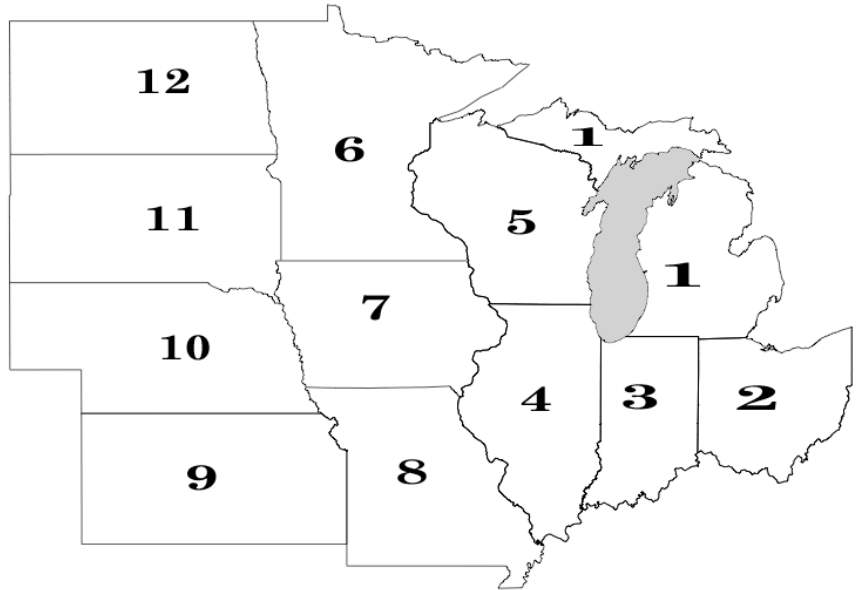

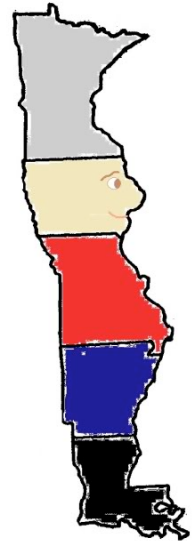

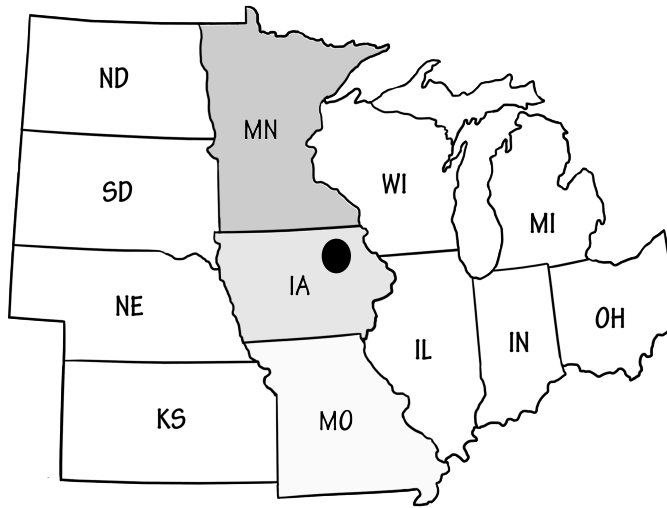
States of the Midwest Region

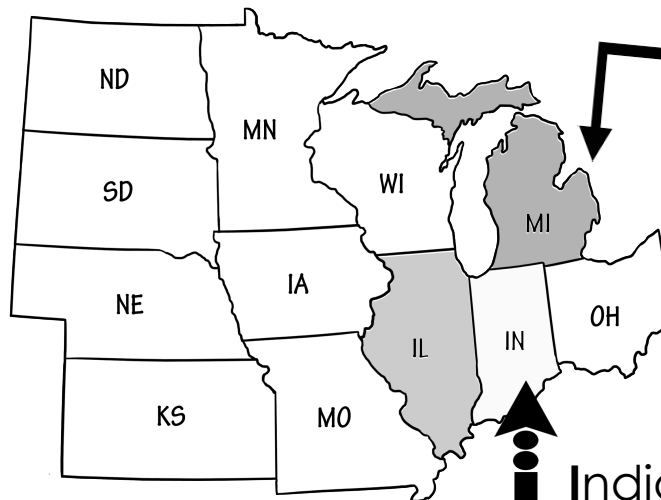
Minnesota, **Iowa**, and **Missouri** make the **Man** in the **Map**.

the shirt.

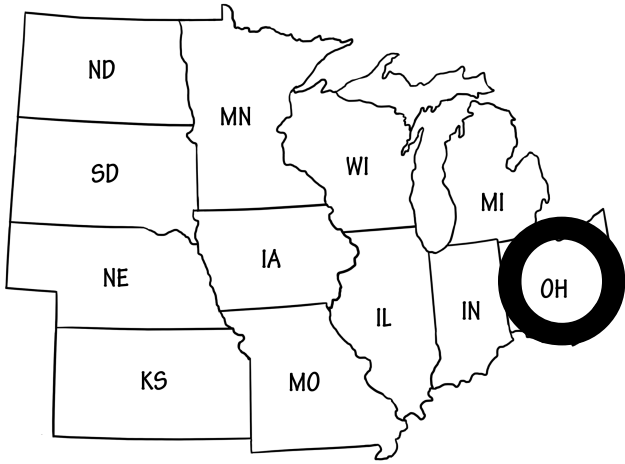


Mim got **ill**,

Wisconsin.



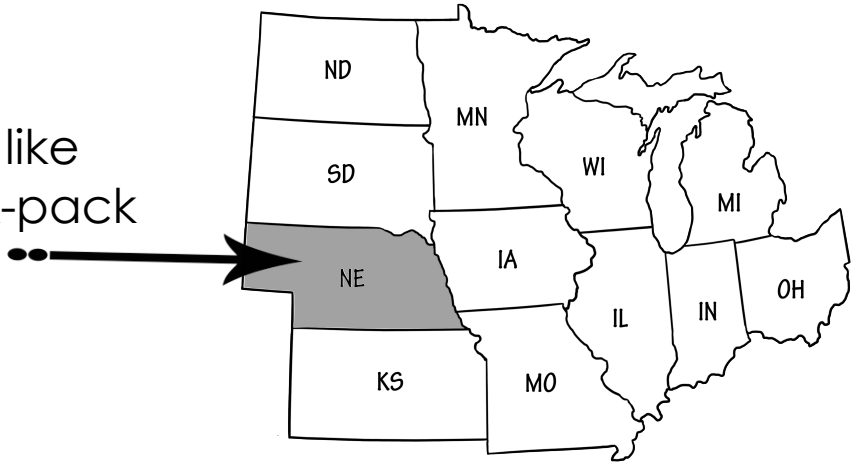
Michigan

in the mitten.

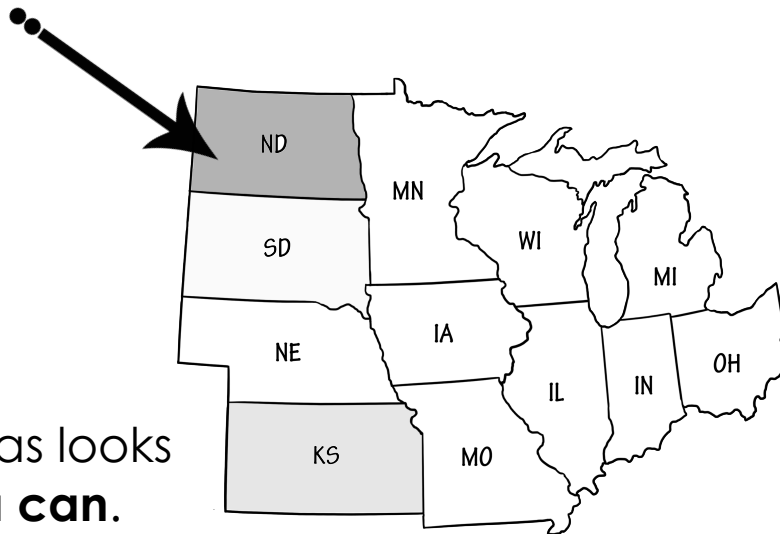


Ohio is shaped (sort of) like an O.
